



CITY OF MADISON HEIGHTS LOW GROWING TYPES OF TREES FOR RIGHT-OF-WAY:

CRABAPPLES

- RED JEWEL: GROWN FOR ITS SPLENDID WHITE FLOWERS AND ATTRACTIVE, BRILLIANTLY-COLORED RED FRUIT.
- ZUMI: VALUED FOR ITS PROFUSE, SPRING BLOOM OF FRAGRANT, WHITE FLOWERS AND FOR ITS GLOSSY, SMALL, BRIGHT RED CRABAPPLES WHICH MATURE IN THE FALL AND OFTEN PERSIST INTO DECEMBER. A DENSE, ROUNDED-TO-SPREADING, DECIDUOUS TREE WHICH GROWS 12-20' HIGH.
- DOUBLOONS: ROUNDED DECIDUOUS TREE. LEAVES ARE DENSE, OVATE, OFTEN LOBED, DARK GREEN, UP TO 3 INCHES LONG. RED BUDS DEVELOP INTO WHITE, DOUBLE FLOWERS IN SPRING. FRUIT ARE GOLDEN YELLOW, APPROXIMATELY THE SIZE OF A CHERRY. GROWS 10 TO 12 FEET TALL AND 8 TO 10 FEET WIDE.

IVORY SILK LILAC TREE

- TYPICALLY GROWS TO AS MUCH AS 30' TALL AND 20' WIDE WITH AN OVAL-ROUNDED CROWN. ITS BEST ORNAMENTAL FEATURE IS ITS SHOWY, FRAGRANT, CREAMY WHITE FLOWERS THAT BLOOM IN UPRIGHT PANICLES TO 12" LONG IN LATE SPRING TO EARLY SUMMER.

KOUSA DOGWOOD

- A SMALL, DECIDUOUS FLOWERING TREE OR MULTI-STEMMED SHRUB THAT TYPICALLY GROWS 15-30' TALL, WITH A VASE-SHAPED HABIT IN THE EARLY YEARS BUT EVENTUALLY MATURING TO A MORE ROUNDED FORM. BLOOM OCCURS IN LATE SPRING.
