### 404. Ordinance Number 454 - Second Reading.

Motion by Councilman Hudson, Supported by Councilman Breckenridge,

RESOLVED, to adopt Ordinance Number 454 on second and final reading as follows:

#### ORDINANCE NUMBER 454

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NUMBER 96, BEING AN ORDINANCE CODIFYING AND ADOPTING A NEW CODE OF ORDINANCES IN THE CITY OF MADISON HEIGHTS, BY ADOPTING AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A COMMISSION TO DETERMINE SALARIES TO BE PAID ELECTED OFFICIALS OF THE CITY OF MADISON HEIGHTS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STATUTES OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN.

## THE CITY OF MADISON HEIGHTS ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. That there shall be added to the Code of Ordinances of the City of Madison Heights, new sections to be known as Sections 2-101, 2-102, 2-103, 2-104 and 2-105, as follows:

SECTION 2-101. There is hereby created a commission to establish compensation for elected officials of the City of Madison Heights. The commission shall consist of 7 members who are registered electors of the City and shall be appointed by the Mayor, subject to confirmation by a majority of the members elected and serving as the legislative body of the City.

SECTION 2-102. The term of office of each of the members shall be for seven (7) years except that of the members first appointed, one each shall be appointed for terms of 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 years. All first members shall be appointed within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this ordinance. Thereafter, members shall be appointed before October 1 of the year of appointement.

SECTION 2-103. Vacancies shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term. Any member or employee of the legislative, judicial or executive branch of the City or members of the immediate family of such member or employee shall be ineligible to be a member of the commission.

SECTION 2-104. The commission shall determine the salaries of elected officials in the City which determination shall be the salaries unless the Mayor and Council by resolution adopted by 2/3rds of the members elected to and serving shall reject them. The determinations of the commission shall be effective 30 days following the filing with the City Clerk of such determination unless rejected by the legislative body. In case of rejection, the existing salary shall prevail. Any expense allowance or reimbursement paid to elected officials in addition to salary shall be for expenses incurred in the course of City Business and shall be accounted for to the City.

SECTION 2-105. The Commission shall meet for not more than 15 session days in 1972 and every odd numbered year thereafter and shall make its determination within 45 calendar days of its first meeting. The majority of the members of the commission shall constitute a quorum for conducting the business of the commission. The commission shall take no action or make no determination without concurrence of the majority of members appointed and serving on the commission. The Commission shall elect a chairman from among its members. "Session Days" means any calendar day which the commission meets and a quorum is present. The members of the commission shall receive no compensation but shall be entitled to their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

SECTION 2. All ordinances, and parts of ordinances, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after its adoption and upon publication.
