51. Environmental Citizens Committee - Created.

Motion by Councilwoman Russell,
Supported by Councilman McGillivray,

WHEREAS, the environment and health of the citizens is a matter of special concern to the City Council;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that:

1. There is hereby created an Environmental Citizens Committee which shall serve in an advisory capacity to the City Council.
2. The purpose of the Environmental Citizens Committee shall be:
 - a. To advise and assist in the execution of the City's environmental programs including, but not limited to, recycling and incineration.
 - b. To educate the public and encourage citizen participation in programs and projects to improve the environment.
 - c. To coordinate programs and projects referred by the City Council.
3. The Environmental Citizens Committee shall be composed of:
 - a. Not less than 9 members nor more than 15 members.
 - b. Members of the Environmental Citizens Committee shall be appointed by the City Council for two year terms.
 - c. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
 - d. Non-residents may serve in an advisory capacity upon majority vote of the members of the Committee.

4. The Environmental Citizens Committee shall meet at least monthly on a day and time selected by a majority of the members.
5. The City Council shall review the existence of the Committee every two (2) Years.

52. Industrial Development District - Industrial Relocation.

WHEREAS, Act Number 198 of the Public Acts of 1974, as amended, providing tax incentives to industry to renovate and expand aging plants and to build new plants in Michigan, required approval of the local legislative body from which a company is proposing to move; and

WHEREAS, Johnson Controls of 32661 Edward, whose move to Plymouth Township, Wayne County, is in the best interests of the company in terms of location to serve its customers; and

WHEREAS, Johnson Controls, will make formal application to the Plymouth Township Board for the establishment of an Industrial Development District pursuant to Act 198 of the Public Acts of 1974, as amended, relating to a new facility to be constructed within the boundaries of Plymouth Township; and

WHEREAS, Johnson Controls will transfer 44 employees from the City of Madison Heights to the new Plymouth Township facility; and

WHEREAS, the City of Madison Heights, after reviewing the Johnson Control's request, has determined that there will be no material or adverse impact on the City of Madison Heights by reason of such consent;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Madison Heights, as the local unit of government from which employment is to be transferred as a result of the company's new facility, and in accord with the requirements of Section 9 (2) (d) of Act Number 198 of the Public Acts of 1974, as amended, does hereby consent to the transfer of employment from the City of Madison Heights to the City of Plymouth.
